Skeletal class III malocclusion may either be associated with maxillary retrusions, mandibular protrusion, or a combination of the two.[4,5] These complex cases require careful treatment planning, an integrated approach and patient cooperation. Orthodontic management of the Class III malocclusion has been a genuine challenge to the profession and remains a controversial issue among clinicians and researchers. Some support the dictum that growth and size of the craniofacial complex are genetically predetermined and cannot be altered. Early treatment of Class III malocclusion has been attempted with varying success. The main advantage of early Class III malocclusion treatment is to avoid surgical intervention and thus reduce the morbidity of the surgery. The timing of early treatment is crucial for a successful outcome.
